13. What needs to change in your life so that you too could be considered blameless?


14. In what areas of your life are you finding success in walking with God? What do you need to do to safeguard this success?

5. Satan continues to be at work in chapter 6 of Genesis. What seems to be his main objective throughout the rest of the Old Testament? (Genesis 3:15)

6. What is the focus of verse 5? How does the last statement in this verse compare with how people are behaving today? (Romans 1:18-32; II Timothy 3:1-9)

7. According to verse 6, why do you think God is “grieved that He had made man on the earth?” Who is to blame for man’s wickedness? Why does God allow evil in this world?

8. From this passage and the rest of the Bible, what are the ultimate implications of intermarriage between the godly and the ungodly? (I Corinthians 15:33; II Corinthians 6:14-18; Exodus 34:12-17; Deuteronomy 7:3-4)

9. What kind of person was Noah? How did he find grace with God?

10. From where did Noah and Abraham receive righteousness? (Genesis 15:6; Hebrews 11:7; Romans 4:9)
