Jews who had come down from Jerusalem stood around him, bringing many and serious charges against him that they could not prove. 8 Paul argued in his defense, “Neither against the law of the Jews, nor against the temple, nor against Caesar have I committed any offense.” 9 But Festus, wishing to do the Jews a favor, said to Paul, “Do you wish to go up to Jerusalem and there be tried on these charges -

But if there is nothing to their charges against me, no one can give me up to them. I appeal to Caesar.” -

the emperor, I ordered him to be held until I could send him to Caesar.” 22 Then Agrippa said to Festus, “I would like to hear the man myself.” “Tomorrow,” said he, “you will hear him.” 23 So on the next day Agrippa and Bernice came with great pomp, and they entered the audience hall with the military tribunes and the prominent men of the city. Then, at the command of Festus, Paul was brought in.

26 But I have nothing definite to write to my lord about him. *26:1 So Agrippa said to Paul, “You have permission to speak for yourself.” Then Paul stretched out his hand **and made his defense**: 2 “I consider myself fortunate that it is before you, King Agrippa, **I am going to make my defense** today against all the accusations of the Jews, 3 especially because you are familiar with all the customs and controversies of the Jews.-*
