
12. How are you supporting missionaries above and beyond your regular tithes and offerings?

3. What do you like best about returning home after a long trip? What do you dread the most?

Digging Deeper

4. Claudius' order in verse 2 was given in 50AD after a Jewish riot in Rome over the preaching of Christ. How did this event end up shaping Paul's ministry?

5. How did Paul's ministry change with his partnership with Priscilla and Aquila? How did Paul's ministry change after Timothy and Silas finally caught up with Him? (2 Corinthians 11:9)

6. How might Paul feel about the beginning of his ministry at Corinth? (1 Corinthians 2:3)

7. How might the vision from God in verses 9-10 and the gift from the Philippians have encouraged Paul?

8. What can we learn from Paul's relationship with Priscilla and Aquila? How did they become a great asset to Paul?

9. What kind of person was Apollos? How did God end up multiplying ministry in an amazing way through him? (V27-28; 1 Corinthians 3:4-6)

10. How strange and wonderful is the providence of God in how Paul was cared for in His ministry?

11. In this passage the Jews tried to get the Roman Proconsul to outlaw the Christian faith, but what ultimately happened? How was Paul able to avoid opposition from the Roman government?
