#### Getting Started

1. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling?
2. Who was the favored child in your family growing up? How did favoritism affect your family dynamics for you personally?
3. Would you say that the people you work with or go to school with are mostly moral people or immoral? What morals do most people you encounter hold to or do people feel that most anything goes?

### **Digging Deeper**

4. According to verse 9 there will be trouble and distress for those who live in rebellion against God. Why is this so? What kind of trouble and distress should be expected?

5. According to verse 10 what three things should a person expect to find in following after God in doing what's right? In what way will these things be made manifest in a person's life?

6. What is God trying to tell us in verse 11? What does this mean for you? What does this mean for others?

7. How would you explain the meaning of verse 12? From this verse is God's law important or not? Why or why not?

8. What does Paul make very clear in verse 13? What keeps us from actually being doers of God's law?

9. According to verses 14 and 15 what has God done with His law for everyone in the world? What evidence do we have that demonstrates the truth of these verses?

10. How does our conscience bear witness to our hearts about our need to follow God's law? Are our consciences ultimately fully reliable? Why or why not?

11. According to verse 16 what should we anticipate happening in the future? What is the gospel ("my gospel") that Paul is referring to? What difference should all this make in our own lives?
