Getting Started

1. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling?
2. What is the closest you have ever come to losing your life? What happened?
3. What are some talents that other people have that you wish you could master? What are some things that you know you are good at but you know you haven't mastered?

Digging Deeper

4. What are the implications to Paul's questions and answer in verses 1-2? How do people take advantage of God's grace in an inappropriate way in this area?

5. How should Paul's argument in verses 1-7 affect someone who wrestles with addictions or other other life-dominating sins?

6. The idea of death and resurrection is mentioned 15 times throughout this passage. What is Paul trying to tell us?

7. In verse 11 what does it mean that we are dead to sin? How is this possible? How is Christ the example here?

8. If we are truly dead to sin, why do so many Christians still wrestle with sin? How can we explain this battle? What is the solution for this? (Romans 7:7-25; Galatians 5:16-26)

9. In what way is Christ's death, burial, and resurrection linked to our spiritual walk with Christ? How can we be certain that Christ's life is really being made manifest in our own life?

10. What is Paul teaching in verses 11-13? How can Paul's teachings be put into practice in practical ways in our lives?

11. What hope is there for the Christian throughout this passage from the positive statements in verses 4, 7, 11, and 13?
