Getting Started

Digging Deeper

4. Based on what you know about the apostle Paul's life, from verse 7 how had God worked in Paul's life up to this point?

5. From verses 7-8 what is clear about Paul's purpose and calling? How committed to this calling does he seem to be? Is Paul being hard on himself in verse 8, or just appropriately humble? Why?

6. What exactly is the mystery Paul is talking about in verse 9? (3:2-6)

7. From verse 10, how has God intended to use the church to accomplish His will? How effective has the church been in accomplishing what God has intended for us?

8. According to verses 11-12 what is the eternal purpose that God has had for us from the very beginning?

9. How would you describe Paul's prayer from verses 14-21? What are some of the main themes of the prayer?

10. From this passage, how would you compare Paul's passion to share this mystery to your own passion?
