6. From verse 3, how does humility play a part in the “renewing” of our minds? How should we think about ourselves?

7. From verses 4-8, list the gifts and character traits that God has blessed His people with? Why would God give some gifts to some and other gifts to others?

8. In verse 9, what does it mean for love to be sincere or genuine? Why is sincerity and being genuine with our love so important?

9. From verses 9-21 list the responsibilities that Paul calls every Christian to live by. What areas come naturally for you? What areas do you need to work on the most?
