## Getting Started

1. What idea, thought or application caught your attention from this past Sunday's message?
2. Explain the meaning of “fellowship”. Why do we need fellowship?
3. How can fellowship among believers be strengthened? How can fellowship be weakened?
4. How does our fellowship with Christ effect our fellowship with each other?

## **Digging Deeper**

5. Glance over Acts 2:1-41. What significant events took place? How did people respond to Peter's Gospel presentation (v 37)? What is Peter's answer (vv 38-40)?

6. What were the results of Peter's preaching (v 41)? What challenges did this give to the apostles?

7. Many commentators view the coming of the Holy Spirit upon believers on the Day of Pentecost as the beginning of the Church. In what activities did the early church engage (vv 42-47)?

8. According to v 42 believers worshipped God together. What were various aspects of their worship? How are these aspects important in our lives?

9. What effect did their worship and fellowship with each other have on the people (vv 43-45)? How did it bring change in their relationships with other believers? To what extent does that apply to us?

10. Describe what fellowship looked like in the early church (vv 46-47). Compare and contrast their fellowship with our fellowship today.

11. What is the result of believers worshipping, caring for, and fellowshiping with each other (vv 46-47)?

12. How are unbelievers effected by genuine fellowship of believers? Why is this so crucial for the times in which we live?
