We Believe: Article 6 - The Holy Spirit Sunday: 10/15/2023 - Pastor Lenard Tavernelli

"We believe that the Holy Spirit, in all that He does, glorifies the Lord Jesus Christ. He convicts the world of its guilt. He regenerates sinners, and in Him they are baptized into union with Christ and adopted as heirs in the family of God. He also indwells, illuminates, guides, equips and empowers believers for Christ-like living and service."

Overview:

This week Pastor Lenard taught us from Article 6 from the Statement of Faith. This article speaks to us about the Holy Spirit. Pastor Lenard brought clarity to the subject that often gets confused by many in the church. What is basic in word sometimes gets lost in practice. The Holy Spirit is a person, a member of the Trinity. Many incorrectly see the Spirit as an unseen impersonal force. This is so far from the truth and is in the truest sense blasphemous. The Holy Spirit is personal. He is our counsellor and our helper.

As Jesus prepared to depart, he introduced his disciples to the advantage we have with the Holy Spirit, that God would come to us, bring conviction, and guide us. The Spirit by the will of God provides his people gifts for his Kingdom. The Holy Spirit seals us, meaning we are identified as his Children. We are part of the family of God. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit should not only manifest gifts in our lives, he unifies us as a body and should produce a spirit in us of thankfulness and praise for Jesus.

 - b. How can baptism in the spirit be taken the wrong way or abused?
- 4. The last sentence (read it) of the article speaks to what the promise of the Spirit means? What does Christ-like living and service mean for you?
 - a. What steps do you need to take to use the gifts the Spirit has given you?

He also indwells (Jn. 14:17; Rom. 8:11; 1 Cor. 3:16), illuminates (1 Cor. 2:2; 2 Cor. 4:4-15; Eph. 1:17-19; Phil. 1:9-11), guides (Jn. 16:13; Acts 15:28; Rom. 8:4, 14; Gal. 5:16, 18), equips (Rom. 12:4-8; 1 Cor. 12: 4-10; Eph. 4: 7-11; 1 Pet. 4:10-11) and empowers (Acts 1:8; 10:38; Rom. 15:13; 1 Cor. 12:11; Eph. 3:16; 2 Tim. 1:7) believers for Christ-like living and service (Acts 6:8; Rom. 8:4-6, 12-16; 2 Cor. 13:14; Gal. 3:3, 5; 5:22-23, 25; Eph. 2:22; 4:3; Phil. 2:1-2).
