1. ICEBREAKER (5–10 MINS)

What is one time in your life when you had to do something without knowing exactly how it would turn out?

2. READ TOGETHER

*Have someone from your group read aloud **GENESIS 12:1–3**.*

Ask: As you listen, pay attention to what God asks Abraham to leave, and what God promises to do. What stands out to you most in the passage, and why?

3. Group Discussion (30–40 mins)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS: *(Use the most helpful questions for your group.)*

- 1.** The sermon reminded us that Abraham was not seeking God, but was a pagan when God called him. What does that reveal about the kind of grace God shows in salvation?
- 2.** God tells Abraham to leave his country, his kindred, and his father's house without telling him all the details. Why is it hard for us to obey when God does not give us the full picture?
- 3.** What are the things you most naturally look to for identity, safety, or security? What would it look and feel like for God to call you to loosen your grip on them?
- 4.** The sermon emphasized that God does not always give us all the information we want, but He still demands obedience.

Where in your life are you tempted to delay obedience until you feel more certain or more in control?

5. God makes repeated "I will" promises to Abraham. What does this passage teach us about the difference between God's faithfulness and our tendency to live by sight?
6. Abraham had every visible reason to doubt. He was old, Sarah was barren, and the promise seemed impossible. Where do God's promises feel difficult for you to believe right now because your circumstances seem to say otherwise?
7. The sermon showed that God's promise to Abraham was never just about Abraham. It was always for the nations. How does that confront the smallness of the way we often think about our own lives and faith?
8. If God's mission is to gather a people for Himself from all nations, what might it look like for you to live more intentionally in that mission this week, in prayer, in conversation, or in invitation?

9. How does Genesis 12:1–3 connect to our mission to "Proclaim the truth of Jesus and grow mature disciples for the glory of God"?

This passage shows that from the beginning, God's plan was never limited to one man or one family alone. His promise to Abraham was always moving outward toward the nations, and that promise is fulfilled in Christ. We proclaim the truth of Jesus when we announce that the blessing promised to Abraham is now offered through faith in Christ to all peoples. Mature disciples are formed as we learn to live by faith, obey God without demanding full control, and join His mission in the world.

10. How does this passage reshape our core values as a church?

- **Worship:** We worship the God who calls, promises, and saves by grace.
- **Bible Knowledge:** Scripture helps us see how God's promises hold the whole Bible together and are fulfilled in Christ.
- **Fellowship:** We remember that we are one family by faith, sons and daughters of Abraham through Christ.

- **Prayer:** We pray with faith in God's promises, even when we do not yet see how He will fulfill them.
- **Service:** We serve with open hands, ready to obey when God calls us to costly faithfulness.
- **Giving:** We hold our resources loosely because our lives belong to God and His mission.
- **Evangelism:** We speak the gospel boldly because God's blessing in Christ is for all who believe.
- **Missions:** We live with the nations in view because God has always been gathering a people for Himself from every people group.

4. Prayer (10–15 mins)

Thank God for His gracious call and ask for faith to obey His promises and join His mission.

Prompt:

Father, thank You that You are the God who calls sinners by grace and keeps every promise You make. Thank You that Your promise to Abraham has reached even us through Jesus Christ. Forgive us for the ways we cling to comfort, control, and security instead of trusting You. Help us obey You even when we do not have all the details. Strengthen our faith when Your promises seem impossible to us. Make us a church that lives on Your mission, prays for the nations, and speaks the gospel with courage and love. In Jesus' name, amen.
